## STEM Grant: LEGO









We were very fortunate here in Scoil an Chlochair to be one of the very lucky schools in receipt of the STEM grant. Our school received €9575. On the 27<sup>th</sup> of February, Robert McHugh came to the school and delivered our SPIKE essential robotic kits. The children in 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> class had a tailored workshop each for 90 minutes. The staff also received 2 hours of invaluable training after school. This is a wonderful opportunity for the children in the school. The LEGO will be ours to keep and benefit all the children in the school. We are very excited to get working on this.





The children in 3<sup>rd</sup> class participated in Peace Proms on Sunday the 4<sup>th</sup> of February in the RDS. They were absolutely outstanding on the day. The orchestra, musicians and all the acts were absolutely incredible. It was a day that the children will never forget. A sincere thanks to all the teachers who accompanied the children to Dublin and to all the parents who were in the audience. It was worth every minute of preparation and we hope to do it again with other classes in the future.

# **Our Sacred Space**



We are so proud of our "School Charter" which is visible in our "Sacred Space" inside the reception area of the porch.



One of our themes last term was "The African Market". The children roleplayed at the fruit and veg stall, baked goods stall and the craft stall. In the small World Area, they made miniature markets in shoeboxes using wooden blocks and playdough. There was quite the queue of little figures at their stalls. In the Construction Area, the children built market stalls with fabric canopies, they built farms which supplied the markets with meat, fruit and veg. The children really enjoyed the Junk Art Area which was looked after by the student teacher where they created all sorts of animals, etc. The class looked at the book "Handa's Surprise" and they learned to identify various African fruit and animals.











"The Vet" was the topic of our next theme. We learned about the job of the vet, Springtime, baby animals and chicks. In our Role-Play Area the children enjoyed being vets and looking after animals with hurt legs, broken wings, etc. In the Small World Area we had a Vets Surgery as well as boarding kennels for all the sick dogs, cats, rabbits, hamsters, farm animals, etc. The children created animal homes in the Construction Area and in the Sensory Area they added playdough whiskers to pictures of cats, collars on dogs, fish for the fish bowl, etc. The picture book we used for "Book Talk" was "Mog and the V.E.T." by Judith Kerr. We had lots of fun with this one. We also made a digital book called "Our Favourite Pets".



The class thoroughly enjoyed our "Bring your Pet to School Day". Thank you to all the parents who brought in pets. We had dogs big and small, cats, hamsters and a lizard.



The latest theme which we are in the middle of is "The Puppet theatre". We have been listening to lots of fairytale stories, doing puppet shows, eating popcorn at the theatre, selling snacks during the interval, building houses for the Three Little Pigs, etc





Of course, alongside all of this we have been busy learning letter sounds and blending sounds to make words. The children are doing a great job of sounding out the letters and reading short words. It's great to see their faces light up as they achieve new skills. In Maths we have done lots of activities based on numbers 0-5. Next we will be doing the topics Weight, more 2D Shapes and Data.

The children have been working very hard at their phonics and diagraphs. With lots of games and interactive activities the children are creating more and more words each day – what a clever bunch!






English We did some active learning during our grammar lessons. We played a board game to help us learn about nouns.





<sup>4<sup>h</sup> Class News - March 2024.</sup>


The last few weeks have been extremely busy here in 6<sup>th</sup> class.

- <u>Confirmation</u> Confirmation went very well in the Cathedral of Christ the King on 6<sup>th</sup> February 2024. Everyone looked great. Well done to Amy who read very well.
- Parent/Teacher meetings the parent meetings went extremely well. The students have worked hard this school year and their efforts were evident in their assessment results. They should be complimented on their work efforts.
- 3. <u>First Lego League</u> 4 months planning and preparation went into the Lego League which took place in TUS Athlone on 8<sup>th</sup> February. The holistic approach to learning (S.T.E.M. science, technology, engineering and maths) really interested the students and lead to pair and group work, planning and implementing, communicating and expressing, talk and discussion, active learning, exciting hands-on learning, applying and problem solving, design skills, integrating and connecting and robotics programming in the classroom. Presentation of their learning on the day was complimented by the judges. Well done 6<sup>th</sup> class. The competition was of high standards. All had a great day.





4. <u>Science Blast</u> – our chosen subject to research for Science Blast 2024 was 'Roller-coasters, Why We Don't Fall Out.' So we planned and researched the science behind our topic. We discovered the meaning of gravity, acceleration, g-forces and potential and kinetic energy. We designed and built three different rollercoaster models. These were complex and demanded lots of patience. Working in groups, the students worked hard and the final models can be seen below. The students presented their project to the judges and again, their work and effort was recognised and complimented by the judge. Well done all.



5. <u>Maths Inspection</u> – the Inspectors informed the school that they wanted to take a focus group from 6<sup>th</sup> class and talk to them about their experience of maths and their learning this year. No pressure Mr. Davey. The central theme – The First Lego League. Thank you to parents who signed the consent forms. The chosen 12 students by the Inspectors spent 40 minutes talking and discussing maths. Feedback from the Inspectors was very positive. All students spoke and gave an honest view of their experience of maths. A special mention to Aodhán,

who was personally mentioned by both Inspectors as being polite and knowledgeable in both maths and the Lego League.

Final word – 6<sup>th</sup> class must be complimented for the standard of work they have put in and continue to put in, but also for their behaviour. Two trips out and no issues. I am very proud of you all. Keep it up.
