Safety In School - Our Code of Behaviour

The Board of Management and Staff of Scoil an Chlochair are continually reviewing and updating our school's Code of Behaviour. It is everyone's responsibility to ensure our children, parents, staff and visitors are happy and safe at school. We should all encourage high expectations of behaviour and social responsibility. Please ensure that your children follow the school rules and routines before and after school, and, in the school playground. It is also important that all of us (adults and children) model appropriate language and behaviour. Keeping Safe Online

There is a great deal of concern regarding children's safety online. Children need "Digital Competence". We need to ensure that young children have a capability to do things safely. We need to introduce the internet and the online world in a safe way so that children do not view anything inappropriate online. More guidance and monitoring is needed to ensure that children are safe.

Some suggestions:

- Consider what equipment and at what age is your child ready.
- Find out what they are doing online and who they are in contact with.
- Do a deal with your child. For example a time limit on how much time they can use their phone or tab or be online. No phones tabs computers or laptops in a child's bedroom at night.
- Try not to rely on screens too much to keep children amused.
- Speak to your child about not sharing personal information online.
- Look at the settings on apps and consider restricting the child's viewing eg Netflix.
- Check out the PEGI Rating for video games. Are they PEGI 12 or PEGI 18?
- Many apps such as Snapchat, WhatsApp and TikTok have a minimum age of 13.
- A serious punishment is to deprive a child of their phone or tab. Consider suspending use for a period instead.
- Make sure you are a good role model for your child.
- Reinforce good behaviour
- Chat with your child about what they do online and encourage them to use their screen time for learning and education.
- Finally, you as a parent should know what your child is doing online. You should continually monitor what is going on by regularly checking your child's devices while building up a relationship of trust with your child
